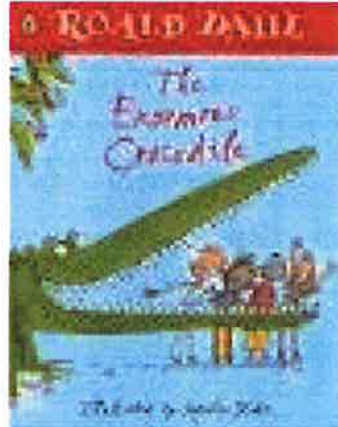

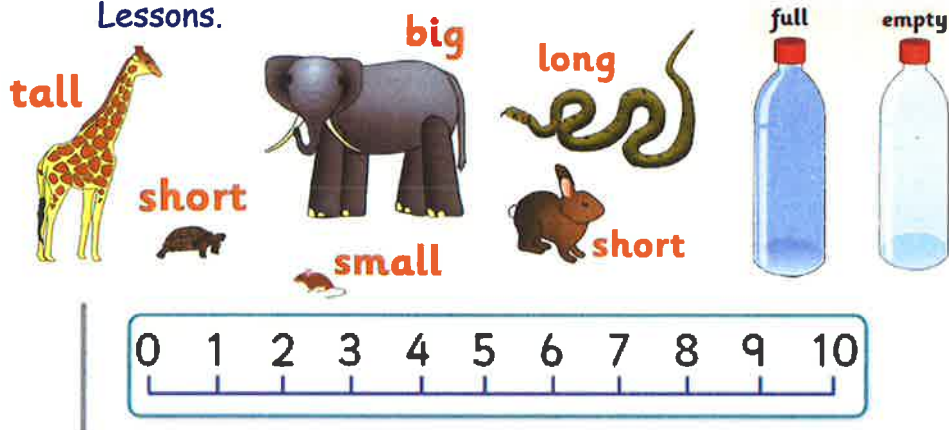

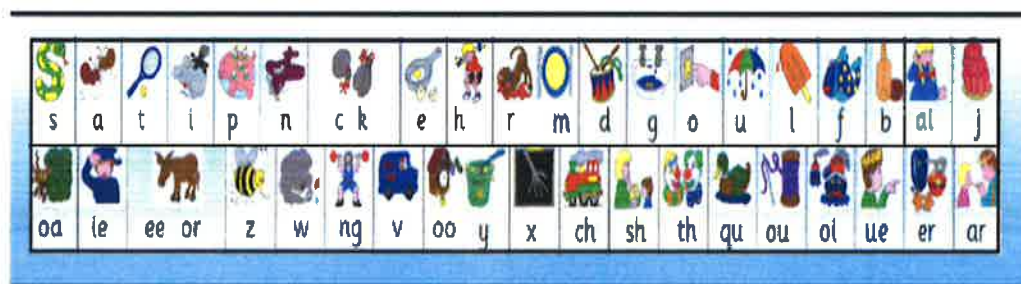

 Wagging their tails behind them



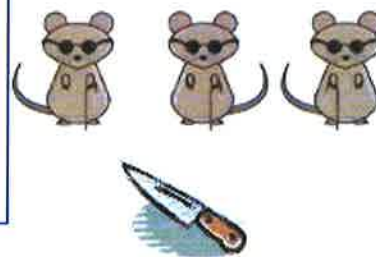
Little Miss Muffett sat on her **tuffet**

 As 3 blind mice, 3 blind mice

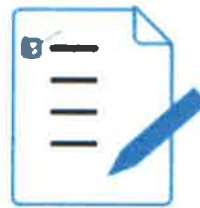


Quality Time

Make Play dough at home for your child
